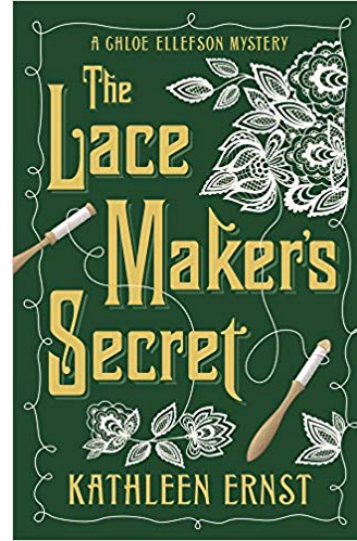
## IOLI CONVENTION, JULY 21-27 in Spokane, Washington
